



Problem

~ 25%-80% of global carbon footprint traced to trade/supply chains^a

Action

- (i) Creating quick response (QR) code-based carbon tracking and reporting system for global supply chains.
- (ii) Green Equipment Facility to support companies upgrading equipment to reduce carbon footprint.
- (iii) Implementing Environmental and Social Management Systems in all partner banks

Problem

ADB's Trade Finance Gaps Growth and Job study identifies SMEs, particularly women led companies historically under-supported in global trade.





- ✓ 17 DMC banks implemented 33 recommendations to enhance their HR policies to attract, retain and promote more women in banking
- ✓ Training and networking for over 500 women entrepreneurs focused on increasing their access to trade finance
- (ii) Implement Disability Inclusion in Trade Initiative
- (iii) Deep-Tier Supply Chain Finance innovation and research for SME inclusion

Problem

Trade-based money laundering linked to crime and terrorism, damages trust and reliability in trade

laundering (TBML) pilot to enhance intelligence, investigations with 5 DMCs^a gained international attention


