

RIF 2023-2025 was prepared through extensive consultative process and based on new criteria to ensure project readiness in terms of feasibility, implementation, financing, as well as alignment with GMS-2030.

The RIF 2025 comprises **111 projects** with a total estimated value of \$**11.7 billion**.

#### Criteria for the New RIF

#### **Minimum Criteria**

- ✓ basic identification project criteria (title, ministry, outcome, outputs);
- ✓ regional impact or spillover effect;
- ✓ supported by active sectors of cooperation under the GMS program (e.g., Working Group);
- ✓ aligned with GMS regional and/or national and sector strategies;
- ✓ meet minimum standards of project readiness and project preparation such as having strong project ownership and a clear project sponsor and having stages of project preparation completed (feasibility study complete, possible source of financing identified, project is included in national investment plans).

#### **Aspirational Criteria**

- multi-country projects with regional benefits;
- ✓ support spatial development (ECD, city clusters);
- ✓ private sector participation;
- ✓ strong gender elements;
- ✓ green projects, or support the blue economy;
- ✓ target poverty alleviation/reduction;
- ✓ align with international principles for quality infrastructure;
- √ foster digitalization.

- ☐ GMS Secretariat will continue to work towards endorsement of GMS RIF 2024-2026 before the end of the year

# GMS 2030 Implementation: Strategic alignment for stronger results



□ The GMS Secretariat is seeking feedback from all sector WGs on a proposed Sector Strategy Framework (SSF)



- ☐ This will facilitate development of the respective sector strategies
- ☐ New SSF will align better with GMS-2030

#### In the context of energy sector, this will require

- □ Synchronization of time spans. New Energy Sector Strategic Framework could be prepared in time to be highlighted by GMS Leaders' Summit in 2024 and go till 2030.
- □ Cascading and aligning the GMS Program results framework (RF) of energy sector with the GMS-2030 RF, endorsed by 25<sup>th</sup> GMS MC in Lao PDR in 2022.

# Supporting programmatic strategic alignment

The Sector Strategy Framework is envisaged as a flexible template that improves alignment and:

- provides consistency across sectors
- can be customized to specific sector needs.

**Energy sector**, for example, is more deeply engaged in 4 of the 6 cross-cutting innovative areas of the GMS-2030:

- Digital revolutionEnhanced spatial approach
- ☐ Dialogue, knowledge sharing, and capacity building
- □ Private sector solutions
- ☐ GMS as an open platform. Cooperation across other regional cooperation and integration initiatives, especially the ASEAN
- □ Results Monitoring

Energy sector is also relatively more strongly aligned with GMS-2030 priorities of <u>digitalization</u>, <u>private sector</u>, <u>gender mainstreaming</u> and environment sustainability.





# Sector Strategy Framework (SSF): Outline of Core Elements



☐ The proposed SSF will provide core elements of sector strategy common across the GMS program.



☐ Each GMS sector will build its own unique programs and plans on this core.



#### **Strategic Alignment: Sector Strategy Framework**



#### **Proposed Table of Contents:**

- **I. Introduction**: provides context, need and justification of the new strategy.
- **II. Situation analysis**: overview and assessment of where things stand, i.e., SWOT analysis.
- **III.** Stakeholder inputs in formulation process: inclusivity, transparency, ownership
- IV. Strategic priorities: vision, mission and strategic thrusts of the strategy. Linkages with GMS-2030, national plans and other development frameworks. Cross-cutting themes (also aligned to GMS-2030). Assumptions and risks, with strategies for mitigating risks.
- V. Implementation aspects: Institutional, HR and financing plans
- VI. Monitoring and Evaluation: Results framework/Theory of change
- VII. Communications and dissemination strategy for raising awareness
